Cyclists skills training – How it fits together

- Larger organisations may have a staff member qualified as an assessor if it has many instructors (or frequent turnover)




Figure 1: Inter-relationship of cyclist skills training parties

- Assessors and instructors may operate independently or be employed / affiliated with a delivery organisation (Figure 1)
- Skills Active is developing a guide for assessors and may develop a guide or workbook for prospective instructors seeking the NZQA qualification. In the following table, these documents are given working titles in italics.
